Get your grocery cards for Safeway and King Sooper before you do your grocery shopping. They are on sale today and in the church office on Tuesday mornings.

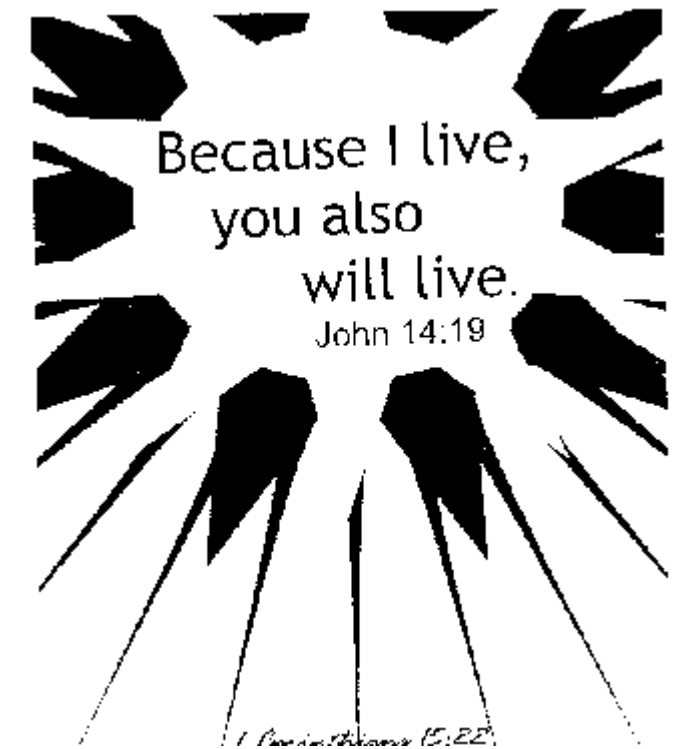
Plan now to bring a food item each time you come to church. The Jeffco Action Center Bin is in the hall. The food item of the month of January for DenUM is beans.
