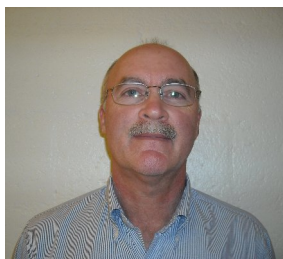

in the United Methodist Church

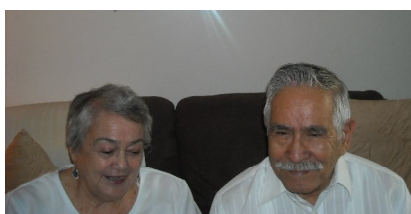
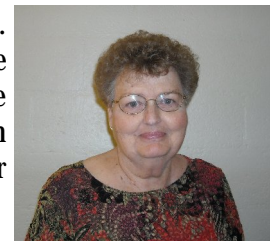
"Motivation for what we do is the crushing poverty in Haiti," said Missionary Rick Jost. "It brings many people to tears when they see how these people live." Peace with Justice Sunday witnesses to God's demand for a faithful, just, and secure world. Drinking dirty water and cooking over open fires - because one has no choice - are justice issues. By building and taking solar ovens to Haiti, Rick and other United Methodists help poor families pasteurize drinking water and cook healthy meals in a safe environment. Established by the 1988 General Conference, Peace with Justice Sunday supports programs that advocate peace and justice at home and around the world. Since half of the offerings collected by your annual conference are retained to fund local peace with justice programs, you can see a difference made locally. In addition, half of the offering is remitted to the General Board of Church and Society to help fund U.S. and global work in social action, public-policy education and advocacy. The United Methodist Church continues to work for a world at one and at peace.

Dear Friends:

In the fifth century B.C. the historian Herodotus came up with the seven wonders of the Ancient World. These wonders were a celebration of human religion, art, mythology and accomplishment. Some of these ancient wonders did not even survive into the Middle Ages (only one survives to this day). We do know that they were impressive enough to be considered great marvels by ancient peoples. The seven wonders of the Ancient World were: The Great Pyramid of Giza, The Hanging Gardens of Babylon, The Statue of Zeus at Olympia, The Temple of Artemis at Ephesus, The Mausoleum at Halicarnassus, The Colossus of Rhodes, and The Lighthouse of Alexandria. Centuries later, someone listed the seven wonders of the Natural World. Those natural wonders are: The Grand Canyon, The Northern Lights, Victoria Falls, Mt. Everest, The Great Barrier Reef, Paricutin Volcano in Mexico and The Harbor at Rio de Janeiro. Incredible wonders are all around us, if only we have hearts and minds that are open and appreciative. This church is here to help you see and experience the wondrous works of God. 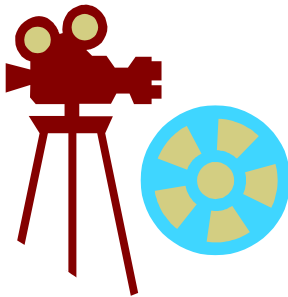

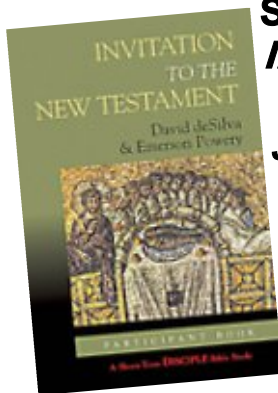
June 7-28: Money Matters: Financial Freedom for All God’s Children

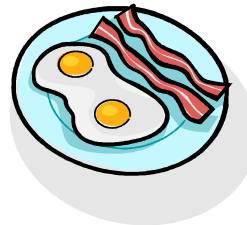
