### Capital Campaign Underway!

The Bold New Beginning Capital Campaign kicks off this month with great anticipation and excitement. This Phase I campaign, designed to raise funds to purchase the land for LUMC's planned relocation and to pay preliminary architect's fees, will officially kick off during services on Sunday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, but many in the congregation participated in the Advance Phase of the campaign, which culminated in a moving dinner and time of commitment on Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup>.

Over the next several weeks, every church household will receive a Campaign Commitment Package, which contains important information about the project, a guide to help people prayerfully discern their support for the campaign, and a DVD reflecting on LUMC's history and future. The packages will mostly be hand delivered to households by church volunteers who are anxious to share this exciting opportunity with their church family.

Closing out the pledge portion of the campaign is a festive All-Church Brunch on Commitment Sunday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, which will follow the 9:00 service (only one worship service that day). Leading up to that celebration will be thousands of hours of work and preparation performed by hundreds of church members (see below). A focused spiritual emphasis is also a vital part of the campaign. A coordinated prayer emphasis and a prayer vigil on Saturday, Oct. 13<sup>th</sup>, are designed to uphold and connect the campaign to the will of God (see related articles elsewhere in this Flame).

We hope that our church, and every friend and member will be blessed as excitement blossoms. We also hope that you've taken some time to prayerfully ask God how you can be a part of Lakewood UMC's BOLD NEW BEGINNING!



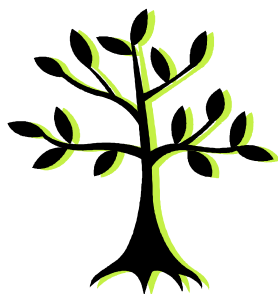

It is the day when Christians worldwide celebrate the blessing of Christ's sacrifice for us and the promise that he dwells with us and within us through this mysterious sacrament. Please join us for this special day. We will have breads from all around the world to symbolize our wonderful diversity as individuals and our unity in the body of Christ. A special offering will be taken which helps to provide scholarships for ethnic minority students all over the world.

## RELOCATION RUMORS, MYTHS & THE OCCASIONAL PARTIAL TRUTH

**Rumor: Our Capital Campaign consultant said God had given her a vision that we were to move, and they were to raise the money for us:** While Tyler & Associates are excited to share our vision and journey of renewal and transformation, we approached them on the basis of recommendations from other area United Methodist churches. Tyler & Associates not only offered us the best price for their consulting service, but their package of services is far superior to the other 4 firms we interviewed.

**Rumor: Relocation is nothing but a gamble, and United Methodists stand opposed to gambling:** Make no mistake, there is a HUGE difference between gambling and the societal ills it causes, and making a bold step of faith, which entails risk, to serve and honor God. Casino gambling, lotteries, and the like, offer the illusion of an unjustified financial windfall; the toll it takes on society and on the addicted gambler is beyond our comprehension, and thus the United Methodist Church rightly opposes these forms of gambling. However, without brave God-honoring people taking bold steps of faith in response to what they discerned as the will of God, we would have no early Christian church, no United Methodist denomination, and certainly no facility at 1390 Brentwood!

**Rumor: Land in the Rooney Valley is no longer for sale:** Land within the Red Rocks Centre commercial development (on the Morrison Rd. side of the valley) and the Rooney Ranch Town Center development (on the Alameda side of the valley) are currently undergoing replatting approvals in response to the developer's determinations of their future market. They are being platted as developments with the SPECIFIC purpose of being offered for sale.

**Rumor: Land in the Rooney Valley is not buildable:** Land in the area, like all land in the western part of Jefferson County may contain swelling soil potential and shale uplift. As evidenced by the many buildings now in the valley (some there for over a century) the valley is buildable. Government regulations require that architects use a consulting Licensed Structural Engineer to engineer a building plan to the specific, soil tested plot on which it will be built. Additionally, the engineer becomes a part of the Architect/Contractor team to ensure the building is built to required engineering specifications.

**Rumor: The whole plan is based upon a "Build it, they will come" philosophy:** Rev. Rosa, staff members and church members are involved in developing the programming and physical aspects of a new campus to ensure our success and growth there. We have visited and studied other relocating churches, and are able to draw on the plans for marketing and programming they have used successfully. We will be well prepared for the people who visit our new facility
